OUR DAILY ITINERARY

FRI, JUNE 8, DAY 1: DEPART USA: We transfer by motor coach from Springfield to Kansas City airport. We board our flight to Dublin, complimentary meals and beverages served aloft.

SAT, JUNE 9, DAY 2: DAY 2: ARRIVAL IN DUBLIN, IRELAND: We arrive at Dublin Airport meet with our coach driver/guide and transfer to the city centre for an orientation tour of the city.

Enjoy a panoramic tour of Dublin City, discovering the north side of the River Liffey. This area offers great striking monuments such as the GPO (General Post Office) on the city main thoroughfare, O'Connell Street, or the Custom House along the quays, as well as the Phoenix Park, the largest public park in Europe.

The south side contains vast Georgian squares, such as Merrion Square, where Oscar Wilde's House can still be found, colorful doors, along with Grafton Street and quality shops. On Kildare St., we see the house of Bram Stoker, the author of Dracula. This part of the city is also dominated by the students of Trinity College, where the famous book of Kells is permanently exhibited in its library.

► VISIT TRINITY COLLEGE

Trinity was founded in 1592 by Queen Elizabeth 1st on grounds confiscated from an Augustinian priory and is the oldest University in Ireland. Built to further the education of the ruling Anglo-Irish families, restrictions were imposed to prevent Catholic from attending courses. These restrictions were not fully lifted until the 1970's. Trinity however admitted women in 1902, earlier than most British universities. Trinity College has had many famous students such as Jonathan Swift and Samuel Beckett who later became a lecturer in French at the university. The Inter-denominational Church is very much worth a visit, should it be open during your visit.

► VISIT ST. PATRICK'S CATHEDRAL

St Patrick's is the National Cathedral of Ireland and is built on the site where St Patrick preached. There was a small church on the site which was still in existence when the Anglo-Normans arrived. This church was replaced with a stone church in 1191 and it was further remodeled in 1225 to the same design as Salisbury Cathedral. Ireland's first university was founded at St. Patrick's in 1320. St Patrick's is Gothic in style and its splendid interior, is adorned with funeral monuments, such as The Boyle Family Memorial and the grave of Dean Jonathan Swift. Swift was dean here until his death in 1745. The Chancel has ornate stained glass windows, and spectacular choir stalls, once used by the knights of St Patrick adjoin the Altar. The massive west towers, houses a large peal of bells whose ringing tones are so much part of the character of Dublin.

Enjoy the rest of the afternoon at leisure. Transfer to your hotel and check in. Dinner is served at our accommodations. (D)

SUN, JUNE 10, DAY 3: DUBLIN: OPENING CEREMONY FOR CONGRESS: The opening Mass for the event will be held at the Royal Dublin Society, the premier event for congresses and events in Ireland. After the ceremonies are completed, we will have some time on our own for the balance of the day, with dinner served at our accommodations. (B, D)

MON, JUNE 11, DAY 4: DUBLIN: CONGRESS EVENTS: Breakfast will begin each day at our accommodations with a full Irish breakfast. Our motor coach will transfer us to the venue for today's events which will include the following:

• MORNING ACTIVITIES

Morning Prayer, Exhibition Area, Panel Discussions, Music and Drama Presentations, Youth Activities, Concerts, and Films.

• AFTERNOON ACTIVITIES

Catechesis, Testimony, and Eucharistic Celebration.

We will return to our accommodations via motor coach for dinner. We may wish to participate in some of the evening activities, which may require additional motor coach transfers for an additional cost. Evening activities include: Music, Drama Presentations, Youth Activities and Films. (B, D)

TUE, JUNE 12, DAY 5: DUBLIN / ROCK OF CASHEL / KILLARNEY:

We begin with a full Irish breakfast at our hotel. The 13th century gothic cathedral of St. Canice is built on the site of a 6th century Monastic settlement. The town of Kilkenny developed around this settlement. The Cathedral is still very much in use. It has a splendid choir surrounded by beautiful stained glass. Like many of the Cathedrals built during this period it is home to numerous tombs, some very old. There are many legends attached to the Cathedral including the story of how the roof was restored by a William Outlaw as penance for being an accomplice of Dame Alice Kytler, who had been accused of witchcraft. The cathedral has been carefully restored over the years and is still used for the dedication for the Bishops and the Deans of Ossory. A Round Tower, standing proud in the Cathedral grounds, bears witness to the earlier monastic site.

Possibly the most photographed site in Ireland, the Rock of Cashel is one of Ireland's leading tourist attractions. Towering over the town of Cashel from its perch on a 200-foot high outcrop of limestone, the Rock of Cashel was once the seat of the Kings of Munster. St. Patrick visited the rock in 450, while Brian Boru was crowned the 1st high King of Ireland here in the tenth century. Granted to the church in the twelfth century, by the O'Brien clan, the Rock became the seat of the archbishop of Cashel.

In 1647, Cromwellian forces ransacked the Rock. Today, impressive stone walls enclose a round tower, a cathedral, a twelfth century Romanesque chapel and high crosses. The gothic cathedral dates back to the thirteenth century and attached to it is the palace of the Archbishop of Cashel. Cormac's chapel, smaller in structure, displays some typical Romanesque features while the Hall of the Vicar's Choral, at the entrance to the Rock, is a fifteenth century house. The Vicars Choral has been recently restored and its basement houses a small museum of artifacts found on the site. We arrive in Killarney in time for dinner at our hotel, and then we retire for the evening. (B, D)

WED, JUNE 13, DAY 6: KILLARNEY: RING OF KERRY & MUCKROSS

HOUSE: We begin with a full Irish breakfast at our hotel. Today, a tour of the Iveragh Peninsula, will give us the opportunity to travel the Ring of Kerry as we take in spectacular scenery—mountains, peat bogs, lakes and magnificent views of the Atlantic Ocean. Leaving Killarney we pass through Killorglin, famous for its Puck Fair, then to Glenbeigh where the cliff road affords panoramic views of the Dingle Peninsula and Dingle Bay. Continue to Sneem Village, famous because of its brightly colored houses. The road continues through the mountains to Molls Gap and Ladies View with superb views of the famous Lakes of Killarney.

We will visit Muckross House, a nineteenth century country residence with a folk museum. Built in 1843, in Elizabethan style, this house is one of the most sumptuous residences of Ireland. Muckross, surrounded by beautiful gardens, is in the heart of the Killarney National Park, the first opened in Ireland. Dinner and overnight are in our hotel in Killarney. (B, D)

THU, JUNE 14, DAY 7: KILLARNEY: DINGLE PENINSULA:

We begin with a full Irish breakfast at our hotel. Some of the finest coastal scenery to be seen in Ireland can be found in West Kerry, on the Dingle Peninsula, the most northern of the Kerry Peninsulas. This peninsula is famous for its Celtic, pre-Christian monuments and Christian churches.

It is also a 'Gaeltacht' (Irish speaking) area, where the Irish language and traditional ways of life are preserved. Dingle town itself is a thriving fishing town and offers plenty of opportunity for shopping or simply savoring the atmosphere of a typical country Irish town with its plentiful pubs, narrow streets and busy harbor.

The road around the Peninsula is truly spectacular. It passes through a chain of mountains, From Inch, a long beach bordered by dunes and made famous by David Lean's movie "Ryan's daughter," admire the Iveragh Peninsula and Rossbeigh Beach. From Dingle, drive around the coast to Sleah Head. Here the blue of the marine landscape surrounds the Blasket Islands, deserted since 1953. In the distance are the two rocky Skellig islands, where the ruins of an early Christian Monastery can be found. The Dingle Peninsula will charm us with its villages painted in bright colors and will bewitch us with the dramatic beauty of its landscapes.

Gallarus Oratory is the most impressive early Christian monument on the Dingle peninsula. It has withstood the passage of time for over 1200 years. Built in the shape of an upturned boat, the oratory formed part of a larger monastic site and was used as a place of prayer and reflection. With its small entrance doorway and round-headed east-facing window, it is an excellent example of dry stone construction.

Dinner and overnight are at our accommodations in Killarney. (B, D)

FRI, JUNE 15, DAY 8: KILLARNEY / CORK / BLARNEY CASTLE / DUBLIN: We begin with a full Irish breakfast at our hotel. Cork is the Republic's second largest city and lies near Cork Harbor—one of Europe's largest natural harbors. The city was founded as a monastic site in the seventh century by St. Finbar and was developed as a trading post by the Vikings in the ninth and tenth centuries. This is a charming university town with many beautiful Georgian and Victorian townhouses

The English market in Cork City centre is a covered market for fish, fruit, meats and vegetables the origins of the market can be traced to 1610, but the present building dates from 1786. The tradition of the market is for meat and fish selling and you'll see butchers walking around wearing white coats covered in blood. But in recent years the range of food available has broadened considerably to include fruit and vegetables, as well as an organic stall, a traditional French deli stall, an olive stall, a cheese and pasta stall which also serves coffee and a bread stall.

Attracting visitors from all over the world, Blarney Castle is an ancient stronghold of the McCarthy's, Lords of Muskerry, and is one of Ireland's oldest and most historic castles. Built in 1446, Blarney Castle is famous for its Blarney stone—The Stone of Eloquence, which is traditionally believed, to have the power to bestow the gift of eloquence on all those who kiss it. Many legends tell the story of the Stone, but why not kiss it and find out the truth behind the legend. Dinner and overnight are in Dublin. (B, D)

SAT, JUNE 16, DAY 9: DUBLIN: EXCURSION TO GLENDALOUGH: We begin with a full Irish breakfast at our hotel. We travel South of Dublin into County Wicklow. This region features all the various types of scenery that makes Ireland so beautiful

The English name Glendalough originated from the Irish "Gleann Dá Locha," which translates as "The valley of the two lakes." It was here that St. Kevin, son of the king of Leinster, founded a monastery in the 6th century. From a simple beginning the site grew to become famous as a centre of learning throughout Europe. Standing for 600 years it was destroyed in 1398. Much of what is to be seen today dates from the 10 to 12th century. One of the most attractive features is the fine round tower. A cathedral, stone churches and decorated crosses also survived albeit as ruins.

Glendalough is a magical place, a place tucked beside two dark lakes and overshadowed by the sheer walls of a deep valley. It is one of the most picturesque settings in the Wicklow Mountains or, for that matter, in Ireland. We return to Dublin for the rest of the afternoon at leisure for some personal sightseeing or some last minute shopping. Dinner and overnight are in Dublin. (B, D)

SUN, JUNE 17, DAY 10: DUBLIN: EUCHARISTIC CONGRESS CLOSING MASS & CEREMONY AT CROKE PARK STADIUM: This morning we will transfer via private motor coach to Croke Park Stadium for the Closing Ceremony of the 50th International Eucharistic Congress. Afterward, we return to our hotel for dinner and the evening. (B, D)

MON, JUNE 18: DAY 11: RETURN USA: This morning we transfer to the airport for our return flight to the USA. We transfer to Springfield by motor coach upon arrival. (B)

Note: While no changes are anticipated, there may be unforeseen occasions when certain alterations become necessary to this itinerary, either due to changes in airline schedules or for other reasons. All Masses are subject to local church schedules and substitution with alternate Mass sites if churches mentioned are not available. Subject to Congress' schedule.

Terms and Conditions

Making any payments (cash, credit card or otherwise) towards any tour constitutes your unconditional acceptance of all the terms and conditions stated in this tour brochure. Catholic Travel Centre shall be referred to as CTC within this document. **DOCUMENTS:** US citizens require a valid passport. Other nationalities please inquire with the appropriate embassies. Passports must be valid for six months beyond the tour's return date.

REGISTRATION AND DEPOSITS: A deposit of \$400 per person is required upon registration along with a signed copy of the registration form. Registrations cannot be taken by telephone. Registrations are processed in the order received by CTC. Balance of payment is due 90 days prior to departure. Late payment is subject to \$50 late fee. Late registrations (fewer than 90 days) must be accompanied by full payment by cashiers check only (including the optional passenger travel protection program payment, if applicable), plus a \$50 late fee and are subject to availability. CTC reserves the right to cancel reservations that are not paid in full 75 days prior to departure and to charge cancellation fees/penalties indicated below. A \$25 fee will be charged on all checks returned by our bank.

CHANGES IN INVOICING: Please note that after initial invoicing, any requests for change in form of payment (cash discount vs. standard base) or in package (air inclusive vs. "land only") are subject to a \$50 per person per change processing fee.

INDIVIDUAL CANCELLATION FEES & REFUNDS: All cancellations must be received by CTC in writing via certified mail or facsimile. CTC will process your refund, minus a cancellation fee according to the following schedule:

- 1) \$150 if cancelled at least 150 days prior to the tour's departure date;
- 2) \$300 if cancelled 149 to 90 days prior to the tour's departure date;
- 3) \$400 plus any non-refundable amounts paid to and/or penalties assessed by airlines, hotels, or other suppliers of travel services (up to the total cost of the tour) if cancelled 89 to 8 days prior to the tour's departure date;
- 4) No refunds for cancellations received within 7 days of departure date.
